The Counselor in Training (CIT) program is a 4-week experience for campers completing the 9th and 10th grade who are not 16 years old. It provides leadership opportunities that prepare teens to become staff members and leaders at camp or elsewhere. FSPYMCA CIT programs are designed to enhance interpersonal and communication skills while fostering independence and self-awareness. Successful participants will come away from this program with valuable leadership skills that will serve them well at home, in school, and in their own community. CIT's are campers while preparing for their future potential opportunities as camp counselors. Camper applicants must complete the CIT application to be considered for the program. Entry into the program is competitive and is based upon the completed application. We are offering two four week sessions. You must complete at least one session to be considered for a JR counselor priority interview when eligible for employment (16 years or older).

Cost for the program is \$1200 for the 4 weeks. A deposit of \$100 is due at the time of registration and will be deducted from the session tuition.

Completed applications must be submitted for consideration and acceptance into the CIT program. Applicants who are accepted into the program will be notified within one week of the date the application is received. Once accepted, candidates can register for one of the CIT sessions. We encourage applicants to submit the applications early, as limited space is available. Also, please note that participating in the CIT program does not guarantee a staff position. CITs are evaluated on their performance and will be entitled to a "priority" interview for a Junior Counselor position when they become age eligible.
